INTRODUCTION

- **1.** In this lesson I am talking about other organizations than the church; organizations without and apart from the church.
- **2.** Other bodies designed and established by the will and wisdom of men and controlled by human authority to do the work of the church.
- 3. Examples of the kind of organizations I am talking about:
 - **a.** Orphan asylums or orphan homes.
 - **b.** Colleges.
 - c. Missionary organizations.
 - **d.** Any kind of human institution man may form to do the work of the church.

I. THE CHURCH OF THE LORD CONTRASTED WITH HUMAN ORGANIZATIONS

- **a.** The church is a divine organization Heb. 8:2.
- **b.** It was designed by the wisdom of God Eph. 3: 9 11.
- c. The deity of Christ is its foundation Matt. 16:16 18; I Cor. 3:11.
- **d.** Christ is its Head Eph. 1: 22 23; Col. 1: 18.
- e. Its rule of faith and practice is the blood sealed covenant of Christ Matt. 26: 28; 2 Tim. 3:16 17; Heb. 9:14.
- f. The church is made up of saved men and women redeemed by the blood of Christ Acts 20:28; I Cor. 6:20; Acts 2:47.
- **g.** The church has a divine mission on this earth:
 - i. Preach the gospel to the world I Tim. 3:15; I Thess. 1:8; Mk. 16:15 16.
 - ii. Build up itself in love Eph. 4: 11 16; Acts 2:46; 5:42; 11: 26; Matt. 28: 19 20.
 - iii. Assemble and worship:
 - 1. John 4:24; Heb. 10:25
 - **2.** Acts 20:7; I Cor. 16: 1-2
 - **3.** Acts 2: 42; Eph. 5: 19
 - iv. Supply the needs of its poor:
 - **1.** Acts 6: -1 7
 - **2.** Acts 11: 27 30
 - **3.** ∣ Cor. 16:1 2
 - **4.** I Tim. 5:16

II. GOD GAVE HIS CHURCH ORGANIC FORM (ORGANIZATION)

- **a.** The organization He gave is the LOCAL CONGREGATION
 - i. The divine pattern for this organization Acts 14: 23 "ordained them elders in every church".
 - ii. This pattern was carried out at Philippi Phil. 1: 1.
 - iii. Over and over in the New Testament you read of LOCAL churches:
 - **1.** The Jerusalem church Acts 8:1
 - 2. The church at Ephesus Rev. 2:1

- **3.** Church at Antioch Acts 11: 26
- **4.** Churches at Judaea Gal. 1:22
- **5.** Churches of Galatia Gal. 1:2
- 6. Seven churches of Asia Rev. 1:11
- 7. Churches of Christ Rom. 16:16
- **b.** Equality existed among churches of Christ in New Testament times 2: Cor. 8:14.
 - i. Equal in Foundation I Cor. 3:11
 - ii. Equal in Head Eph. 1:22 23
 - iii. Equal in Structure I Pet. 2: 5 9
 - iv. Equal in Identity Rev. 1: 20
 - v. Equal in Work All congregations are equally related to preaching the gospel.
- **c.** They functioned by Divine Authority Eph. 1: 22 23.
- **d.** Their work was limited by ability 2 Cor. 8:3.

III. SCRIPTURAL OBJECTIONS TO HUMAN ORGANIZATIONS DOING THE WORK OF THE CHURCH

- **a.** Human organizations through which to do the Lord's work <u>reflect upon the wisdom of God</u>:
 - i. The church was designed by God's wisdom and is sufficient to accomplish His purposes.
 - ii. God's way is different from man's Isa. 55: 6 9; I Cor. 1: 27 31.
- **b.** <u>Human organizations supplant the church</u>, usurp the functions God gave the church, and ignore the divine pattern of work.
- **c.** Human organizations defeat the purpose of God that each congregation by functioning according to the divine plan shall be built up to God's glory and honor Eph. 4:16.
 - i. Human organizations rob the church of strength.
- **d.** They ignore God's silence and lack of divine authority, and thus violate the will of God by presumptuous sinning Psa. 19:13.
- **e.** Human organizations are <u>an addition to God's divine arrangement</u> and to His Word, and do not classify as an aid or expedient in the divine plan.
 - i. Human organizations and instrumental music fall into the same classification they are additions.
- f. Human organizations violate the principle of walking by faith 2 Cor. 5:7.
 - i. Faith comes by the Word Rom. 10:17.
- **g.** Men who believe in human organizations to do the work of the church come to believe these are indispensable to the spiritual growth of churches of Christ.
