## "THEY WALKED WITH HIM NO MORE"

#### John 6:66

#### **INTRODUCTION**

- 1. In the sixth chapter of the book of John, Jesus spoke on the bread of life.
- **2.** Many of His disciples heard His teaching on this subject and said, "This is a hard saying; who can hear it?" John 6:66.
- 3. "From that time many of His disciples went back, and walked no more with Him" John 6:66.
- **4.** For lack of faith, NOW as then, disciples have the same experience.
- 5. These disciples, during His personal ministry, disagreed with Christ and walked with Him no more.
- **6.** Many today do the same.
- **7.** The Lord's church has always had too large a "fall-out" rate; someone has said we lose 50% of new members every seven years.
- **8.** We need to evaluate the situation and try to get it stopped as much as we can.
- **9.** In this lesson, I want to ask the following question and answer them:
  - **a.** Can one fall away?
  - **b.** What are the symptoms of falling away from the faith?
  - **c.** What is the prevention for such falling?

#### I. CAN ONE FALL AWAY FROM THE FAITH?

- a. Some will answer "No".
- **b.** Some say that once you are saved you are always saved.
- **c.** If one cannot lose his faith, then why are there so many warnings?
  - i. Peter warns us about Satan I Pet. 5: 8 9.
  - ii. Paul said he could become a "castaway" I Cor. 9: 27.
  - iii. Paul said, "Some shall depart from the faith" I Tim. 4:1.
  - iv. One can deny the faith I Tim. 5:8.
  - v. One can make "shipwreck" of the faith I Tim. 1:19.
  - vi. One can err from the truth James 5:19.
  - vii. One can have an evil heart of unbelief Heb. 3:12.
- **d.** The Tragedy of falling away:
  - i. Can you think of anything worse than losing your fellowship with God, Christ, and the Holy Spirit? I Cor. 1:9
  - ii. This happens to one when he turns back and "walks with Him no more"—I Pet. 3:18.
  - iii. Sin separates a child of God from God Isa. 59:1 2; Acts 8:23.
- **e.** Not only does the Christian lose his fellowship with God when he walks no more with Him, but he loses fellowship with brethren.
- **f.** When one "walks with Him no more" he loses his potential for doing good.

#### II. SYMPTOMS OF FALLING.

- **a.** ACTIONS come from the heart, so when one begins to lose his faith, it is a HEART problem Prov. 4:23; Acts 8:21.
- **b.** Just as a headache may be a symptom of a deeper problem, so the things brethren can see in one who is falling are tell-tale signs of what is in the heart.
- **c.** Each Christian must EXAMINE his heart to see if he is in danger 2 Cor. 13:5.
  - i. Do we continue to worship, but our heart is not in it?
  - ii. Do we continue to give, but grudgingly?
  - iii. Do we continue to listen to the preaching, but with an attitude to find fault?
  - **iv.** Do we continue to talk occasionally to our neighbors about the Lord, but the fire is gone?
- **d.** In time, our actions begin to show to others.
  - i. We miss the mid-week Bible study and the Sunday evening worship.
  - ii. We don't study the Bible as we did.
  - iii. We seldom visit the sick and the shut-ins.
  - iv. We cut back on our giving, or don't give at all.
  - v. We find fault with the elders.
  - **vi.** We begin to find fault with about everything the preacher says.
  - vii. Our job is more important than the Lord's work. . .
  - viii. We don't attend gospel meetings anymore.
  - ix. We are disturbed when the meetings interfere with our social and business appointments.
- e. Brethren, these are symptoms of heart disease, and if it isn't soon corrected, we will fall away.

#### III. SOME CAUSES OF FALLING AWAY:

- a. Underneath all "CAUSES" is Satan I Pet. 5:8.
  - **i.** The devil aims at our weak points, and uses any means to cause on to leave the fellowship of God.
- **b.** Evil Companionship.
  - i. I Cor. 15:33
  - ii. A young man in the Bullitt county jail said, "My friends are the reason I am here".
  - iii. Solomon wives I Kings 11: 1 4.
- **c.** Weakness toward pleasure:
  - i. Many become too busy with the pleasures and the cares of the world to be Christians.
  - ii. Matt. 13: 20 22.
- d. Inability to withstand Persecution.
  - i. Persecution is going to come -2 Tim. 3:12; Matt. 5: 10 12.
  - ii. Matt. 13: 20 21.

#### IV. THINGS THAT WILL PREVENT FALLING.

- a. Christians must be careful to help one another I Thess. 5: 14; Gal. 6: 1-2; Rom. 15:1.
- **b.** Brotherly love is very important in the prevention of one's falling away from Christ Heb. 13:1; John 13: 34 35; Rom. 13:8.
- **c.** Awareness is so very important to the Christian:

- i. If we are always aware of the possibility of falling, and becoming an apostate, surely we will watch for pitfalls I Cor. 10:12.
- ii. Heb. 3: 12 13

a. Brethren, I pray that none of will ever turn from Christ and walk with Him no more.
