WHAT CAN I DO TO HELP?

Galatians 6: 1 – 10 Donald Townsley

INTRODUCTION

- 1. What can I, as one very ordinary individual, do to help the cause of Christ?
- 2. A list of things are given in Galatians 6: 1 10.
- 3. These passages deal with the <u>personal nature</u> of discipleship.
- **4.** They deal with working that which is good toward the souls of men:
 - a. The soul is the most valuable thing on earth Matt. 16:26; 10:28.
 - **b.** The greatest service that can be rendered is "soul service".
- 5. Turn to Galatians 6: 1 10 to see what I can do to help.

I. I CAN RESTORE THE ERRING – Gal. 6:1

- **a.** I can restore my brother or sister in Christ who has been overtaken in a sin.
 - i. Simon Acts 8: 18 24.
- **b.** I must do this in the spirit of meekness Gal. 6:1; Rom. 12: 3; 2 Tim. 2: 24 26.
- **c.** Self-appraisal must be exercised Matt. 7: 1 5.
- **d.** In this work I can help save a soul from death James 5: 19 20.

II. I CAN BEAR MY BROTHER'S BURDEN – Gal. 6:2

- **a.** The word "burden" has reference to the weight or burdens of <u>heart and soul</u>:
 - i. The burden of sickness
 - ii. The burden of trouble
 - iii. The burden of sin
- **b.** The Corinthians were to comfort the brother who had sinned and been restored -2 Cor. 2: 6 -11.
- **c.** A wife can help her husband with his load of cares and responsibilities, and the husband can help the wife.
- **d.** I can help any brother that might be discouraged I Thess. 5:14.
- e. In bearing one another's burdens we fulfill the law of Christ.

III. I CAN FACE THE FACTS ABOUT MYSELF – Gal. 6:3

- **a.** This verse is a warning against self-deception.
- **b.** This verse sets forth the same truth as verse one one must have the right attitude toward Self.
- **c.** An overconfident spirit causes one to fall I Cor. 10:12; Rom. 12:3.
- **d.** We should guard against self-delusions.
- **e.** I can help the cause of Christ greatly by making a realistic appraisal of my own abilities and acting accordingly 2 Cor. 13:5.

IV. I CAN DO MY OWN WORK—Gal.6: 4, 5

- **a.** I have a load, a responsibility, that I must bear in the salvation of my soul Phil. 2:12; Gal. 6:5.
- **b.** So, I must prove my own work by the word of God I Thess. 5:21.
- **c.** I must examine myself 2 Cor. 13:5.
- **d.** I cannot compare myself with others Christ and His word is the standard 2 Cor. 10:12; I Cor. 11:1; I Pet. 2:21.
- **e.** We will be judged by our own works 2 Cor. 5:10; Rom. 14:12; Rev. 20:12.
- **f.** I must discharge my individual responsibilities.

V. I CAN SUPPORT PREACHERS OF THE WORD – Gal. 6:6

- a. Phoebe was a helper of many Rom. 16:2; Philemon 22
- **b.** Gaius -3 John 5-8
 - i. I can speak a word of encouragement.
- **c.** By supporting those that teach the truth one thereby is working that which is good toward all men, both rich and poor Gal. 6:10.

VI. I CAN REALIZE THAT "REAPING TIME" IS COMING—Gal. 6: 7 – 8

- **a.** I can sow to the flesh by investing only in material things in this life.
- **b.** I can sow to the Spirit by investing my money and time in spiritual things.
- **c.** I am sowing to the Spirit when I help men preach the gospel, and when I give my time to restore a brother that has fallen.

VII. I CAN KEEP ON KEEPING ON – Gal. 6:9

- **a.** It has been said that discouragement is the most effective tool in the devil's workshop.
- **b.** God has promised "for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not" Gal. 6:9.
- **c.** I Cor. 15:58

VIII. I CAN DO GOOD UNTO ALL MEN – Gal. 6:10

- **a.** Verse 10 is a summation of the first nine verses.
- **b.** The good that is to be done unto all men is the good in Verses 1-9:
 - i. Restoring a brother v. 1
 - ii. Helping him bear his burdens of heart and soul v. 2
 - iii. By supporting gospel preachers and preaching the gospel v. 6
- c. The "all men" in verse 10 is far more than "the poor":
 - i. The word "all" is just as broad as the word "all" in Matt. 29:19.
 - **ii.** If charity toward the poor is the thing enjoined, we could not work that which is good toward <u>all men</u>, because <u>only a few need physical help</u>.
- d. All men need spiritual help, and this is what is under consideration.
